A Message from our Pastor

The day before Community Day and Festifall I traveled down to Princeton for a special event. A world renowned religion professor, Elaine Pagels, was speaking to a group of Presbyterians about her most recent book, *Why Religion?*. She had come at the invitation of our members. There are several things about the conversation that struck me, but it was the situation in which I found myself that I was most moved by.

I love that our church is curious. Across all age groups and our learning ministries to worship itself, our people want to dig a little deeper. It is so beautiful to see the questions come up about faith, religion, our place in this world. I love that this place makes room for people who are deeply experienced with religion and those who are just dipping a toe in the waters.

I love that we are willing to ask big deal people to come talk to us. We invite others in. We engage in big conversations. Over the years this congregation has hosted in different ways some of the most important thought influencers of the past few generations. This is a real treat, not just personally, but a gift we can offer the local community.

I love that we engage others and invite others in. Increasingly I am seeing an instinct emerge in the members and leaders of this church to invite others in. Many places are content to make sure that the other members of the community are involved, but I am seeing us going beyond our walls. We are inviting friends; we are inviting other congregations. We are sharing these opportunities so that others can have life changing experiences with us.

In this one small gathering, I saw the glimmer of what makes this place so unique, and frankly so wonderful. There was a level of intimacy in the discussion that can only happen in a small gathering, but the sense of it was not that it was a closed group- our whole church had been invited and other churches brought members. They are already off to the next book, planning now to read *Christ of the Celts*, by J. Phillip Newell. What I love is that this book promises to be a serious read, but it isn't academic. It is written for any of us who are curious about faith – especially different ways of being “Christian.”

I am saying all of this because I am excited about our learning ministries, and I have caught their spark and curiosity. 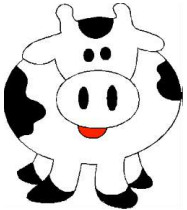
Sunday School Update

From The Director of Music

Hello Everyone,

It would appear that Autumn has found us again -- the weather is changing and school has started again, for those of us involved in one way or another with that arena of life.

At PCW, we had our first evening of COW -- yesterday, in fact, at the time of this writing. C.O.W. (Church on Wednesdays) includes time for singing for children ages 3 - 5th grade.

Every year I understand more deeply the profound role that singing has in the expression of our faith and in becoming fully who God calls each of us to be. We all have a voice, our own voice, unique from all others. Our voice is part of us, we can't leave it behind. At some point in our lives (often far enough into adulthood that we wish we'd figured it out sooner) we learn that we need to be OK with who we are, perhaps even like who we are. I think being comfortable singing out -- in a group or alone -- gives great assist to being "happy to be me." The sooner we learn to love our voices, the better. And learning to love our voices starts best at a young age. Singing is good for all of us, but especially children, everywhere.

We have a good time on Wednesday evenings, so I hope to see you and your children at C.O.W. But more than that, I hope your kids (and you) are singing somewhere.

At the 10 am sanctuary service on October 27, we'll experience the elements of worship primarily through music. We'll sing and hear music representing many facets of our reformed and reforming tradition. From the choir we'll hear works by Brahms, Mozart and Bernstein as well as newer arrangements of a spiritual and hymn. Together, we'll all sing a "great hymn of the church" (or two) and more.

At PCW we're moving past one kind of transition (from interim to called senior pastor) but in transition or not we're always in a time of joyful transformation. As we are open to God's call for how we are to "be" here and now on the corner of Broad St. and Mountain Avenue in Westfield, NJ, as we welcome newcomers and old friends alike in worship and all of our mission and program endeavors, as we serve our community and each other, we can't help but be transformed into the people God calls us to be. In following God's call to us, we are reformed and always reforming. Let's celebrate! See you on October 27.

Session Direction for October 2019

In September our elders met for a Session Retreat to prepare for some exciting new work and we will be planning a much larger joint Session and Deacons retreat in the winter months. This retreat was the next step in carrying out the work from the PCW Mission Study completed a couple of years ago. Together with the pastoral staff, a sense of vision emerged about who we really are as a church. All the common elements of the Mission Study started to come up again, reaffirming that this is a community with a deep sense of belonging and who yearns for others to feel the same, a community in which one can discover a spark we did not know we were seeking. A phrase has emerged "*life change starts here*" as a link with our sense of welcome.

We are now organizing a small group, populated from different segments of the church. This group will work closely with the Session and Jeremy to more clearly define our program and pastoral staffing needs, so that no one in our community feels invisible.

Over the coming months you will be getting more information as Session continues to explore ways to name (1) who we are as a community and (2) the priorities that drive our ministry both *for* our church community and *to* our neighbors. The intent is to become so clear about who we are that every decision, from budget to staffing, will be guided and grounded by our shared sense of direction.

Baptisms at PCW

Baptism is the sign and seal of our incorporation into Jesus Christ. It is God's gift of grace and calls us to respond to that grace. It marks the new beginning of new life in Christ. It unites us with Christ and one another. Baptism holds theological meanings of dying and rising with Christ, pardon, cleansing, and renewal, the gift of the Holy spirit and the incorporation into the body of Christ. PCW offers a Baptism Class for parents requesting a baptism of their child.

The Baptism class is a pre-requisite to the child's Baptism. (Parents must be members of PCW.) Baptisms are held on the second Sunday of each month. Baptism classes are on Sunday after church (11am) and led by The Rev. Cindy Bowman and scheduled quarterly.

Theology Discussion Group Recap

Why Religion? Our Meeting with Professor Elaine Pagels



Over 20 of us met with Princeton Professor Elaine Pagels for a conversation about her new book *Why Religion?* on September 21st in Princeton. The conversation was both stimulating and insightful as we engaged the Professor about her recent memoir and her deep insights into the early spiritual Christian texts. Her mastery of theological and biblical text was inspiring for us to hear as she address some of life's most challenging questions.

• Friday Morning Bible Study

The Book of Revelation, a.k.a. The Apocalypse

For those of us who are intrigued or bewildered by, or even afraid of this last book of the Bible – with its four horsemen, a monstrous red dragon, and the seven-headed beast – we will present the very knowledgeable Prof. Craig R. Koester of Luther Seminary and his course, “The Apocalypse: Controversies and Meaning in Western History”. The word “apocalypse” actually means “disclosure”, as giving insight into a mystery, which in Revelation has to do with the nature of evil and the nature of hope. In 24 lectures, and beginning with the Old Testament prophets, Dr. Koester takes on the birth of the apocalyptic tradition and the cosmic struggle between good and evil, the vision of a new world, and the impact of the book of Revelation on western culture. Revelation asks, what does it mean to live in the presence of God?

Friday Morning Bible Study meets in the George Plenty room at 9:30am for coffee & tea, followed at 10am by a look at Sunday's Scripture reading and the half-hour teaching lecture on disc. Come whenever you can, all are welcome.

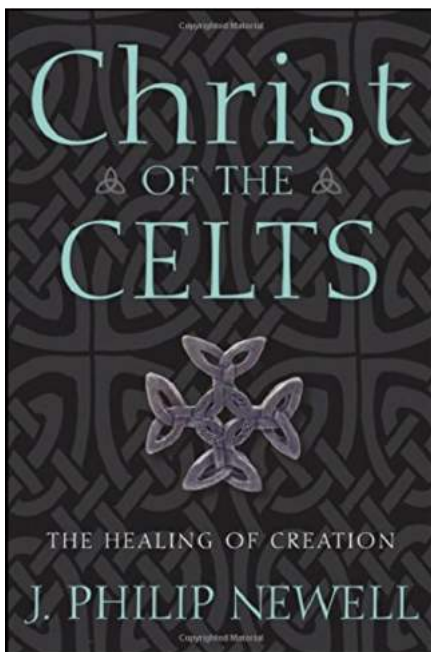

Theology Discussion Group

Our next book will be *Christ of the Celts: the Healing of Creation* by J Philip Newell. We will be starting our next book on October 21st from 7:30-9pm and meet in the Christian Lounge. Hope you will consider joining us as we study this book a chapter at a time.



Drawing on the gospels of Thomas and the Acts of John and on the writings of Irenaeus, Eriugena, and Teilhard de Chardin, the author ignites us with the possibilities that can come from understanding this ancient spiritual tradition. The Celtic Christ offers new hope for achieving harmony, healing, and renewal for human beings and

for all of creation.

Newell connects the Celtic tradition with our more conventional Christian beliefs and offers a vision of concern for healing creation and the environment — for the presence of the sacred in nature and all creatures.

J. Philip Newell is a poet, scholar, and teacher. Formerly Warden of the Iona Abbey in the Western Isles of Scotland, he is now Writer-Theologian for the Scottish Cathedral of the Isles as well as Companion Theologian for the American Spirituality Center of Casa del Sol at Ghost Ranch in New Mexico.
